Dear Parent/Guardian

In order for your child to have the most opportunities for college admissions, careers and scholarships later, it is important that they begin matching their effort to their academic and career goals starting now.

We've created a chart below based on your child's most recent CAASPP scores to help you and your child understand approximately how much additional work they will have to do each week to reach various college and career goals. To be minimally prepared, all students should complete the minimum number of study hours and try to reach at least the 60th percentile.

The higher your child's college and career goals, the more work they will have to put in *above and beyond what their teachers require (even if they have straight A's)*. To reach the highest academic levels and have the most college and career opportunities later, your child should try to miss very few or no questions on any test they take, especially the CAASPP.
